

May is National Foster Care Awareness Month. Foster care affects approximately 430,000 children in the United States of which 100,000 are waiting to be adopted. Children and youth enter foster care because they have been abused, neglected, or abandoned by their parents or guardians. A very high majority of these children have experienced loss and some form of trauma. Foster children, however, are no different from children who are not in foster care: they are learning and growing, like to play and hang out with friends their age, and need the love and stability a permanent home provides. There is a great misunderstanding that these children are “bad” or “damaged”. Some of these children have great hurdles to overcome the abuse they have suffered in the past, but with the proper love and care from a foster or adoptive family, these children’s lives can be transformed. Our community needs to recognize, embrace, and assist these foster children and foster parents by helping them in any manner possible.

The median amount of time, in the U.S., that a child spends in foster care is just over a year. More than half of the children in foster care will be reunified with their parents or primary caregivers, and nearly one-quarter will be adopted, many by their foster parents. Each year, approximately 20,000 youth will age out of the foster care system when they turn 18 or 21, or when they finish high school (depending upon the state in which they live.) These children are at increased risk of poor educational outcomes, experiencing homelessness, and being unemployed.

In West Virginia, there are approximately 7,000 children who are active in the foster care system at any given time. In contrast, there are only approximately 1,300 foster families in our state. In Upshur County, we need to make this issue a priority. In the most current stats, there are over 50 children in foster care with only 19 foster families in our county. It is imperative that our county take action, and there are many ways to do so. If you cannot adopt, then foster. If you cannot foster, then sponsor. If you cannot sponsor, then volunteer. If you cannot volunteer then donate, and if you cannot donate, please educate. Education is one of the strongest tools any person can carry to help children in foster care.

The Upshur County Commission now hereby declares May as Foster Care Awareness Month and urges all citizens to help children in foster care.

I live on Mulberry Ridge Road at French Creek, WV, the DOH plans to barricade and then remove the one lane iron bridge, that services the road to my home and approximately 10 other homes, on the 17 of April and then remove it. I have several concerns, the by pass road they intend for us to use enters Route 20 in a blind turn that is extremely dangerous and will get someone hit and probably killed. The school bus can not navigate our road, due to a very sharp turn on a one lane road, because of this, our kids catch the bus on the Route 20 side of the bridge, this bridge closing would mean our kids would have to walk a section of Route 20, putting them in grave danger. Frankly, anyone entering Route 20 via this bypass, a section of Route 20 that has been out of use since the road was reconfigured in 1960, is endangering their life. The other two options require going the entire length of Mulberry Ridge Road, a steep, narrow, one lane road with only two places to pass another vehicle, someone generally has to back up if you meet another car. The shortest of these options requires a 180 degree turn back onto another section of old Route 20, with a very long drop off down a wooded hill below you and the third requires going a much longer distance up an old section of Route 20. None of these roads are priority in the winter time and many people have ended up in the ditch, with my niece almost sliding over the steep hill at the 180 degree turn, and three have ended up hitting my neighbor's house and that is on our little road, not the old sections of 20, and I believe our little road is the best kept so I can only imagine what we will be facing each and every day. The closing of our bridge will also make EMS and fire response times longer, I am not even sure the big trucks can navigate the one turn. It might only be a few minutes longer, but in case of a house fire or a heart attack those few minute will make a world of difference. My other concerns, this bridge was originally a covered bridge, probably built in the 1800's when most of our homes were built, the current bridge was built in 1925, unfortunately I was told, due to the type of construction, it does not qualify for protection as historic, but it has been a large part of the history of French Creek for more years than we have lived. The current bridge has stood for almost a century now. It is also a Memorial Bridge, dedicated to U.S. Army CPL, Sherald P. Brady who was killed in France during WWII. What a slap in the face of his family to remove this bridge now. Our first notification of this closing came via, the Record Delta newspaper and WDTV posts on Facebook last Thursday, since that time I have been on the phone or Facebook non stop trying to find people to help me save this



bridge. I have reached out to the governor's office and they told me they have opened a case, I have also reached out to Joe Manchin, Greg Boso, the Upshur County Historical Society, Robbie Martin, Bill Hamiton, the French Creek Pioneers, other residents and former residents of the county along with Chad Boram with the DOH Bridge Department 304 269-0400 or 269-8904. Some of us have plastered Facebook with our comments and concerns, the Record Delta has filmed the bypass, the bridge and I believe one of the other access roads. I met with a reporter for WDTV on Saturday and gave her a tour of the options we would have and she was not overly impressed. Another concern, if the bridge crossing Route 20, a very highly traveled road, is closed for repairs or an accident, traffic will have to be rerouted several miles on very narrow country roads to reach Buckhannon, if our bridge is saved, a short hop down the bypass road, across our little bridge and they are on their way into town or where ever they are going. It totally makes no sense to me for them to even consider closing this bridge which I think is a part of the National Road, one of the earliest roads in this part of the state. I was unable to find information regarding this; however, a girl in Greg Boso's office mentioned it to me and when I speak with her again, I will try and find out more regarding this. We should all be protecting our historical places not destroying them and I believe something that has stood for almost 100 years is historic regardless of guidelines to qualify as historic. We would greatly appreciate your help in saving this bridge, and perhaps also saving someone's home or life.

This bridge is on Upshur County Route 4/15. Mulberry Ridge Road, French Creek, WV

**SALE LOCATION:** This sale is located in portions of Map Parcel #5S-51, Banks District, Upshur County, WV. The farm is also located in the northeast corner of Selbyville Youth Camp adjacent to the Selbyville VFD. The timber sale is also situated on the waters of the Right Fork of Buckhannon River.

**DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE:** From Selbyville VFD, go ~0.5 miles east on Brooks Hill Road to the landing in a switchback of Brooks Hill Road. Park on landing and walk skid road across Woody property ~1,700' to the timber sale.

**HARVEST TYPE:** The timber sale contains a total of 46.4 acres. Within the timber sale area, all trees are marked with blue paint at breast height and at stump level. Exterior timber sale boundaries are marked with orange flagging.

**CRUISED VOLUMES AND PRODUCTS:** The timber sale contains 927 marked trees containing 176,234 board feet Doyle Scale. Details on average tree diameter and volume and numbers of trees by species are available on Tree Information page and Timber Sale Bid Sheet. In addition, cull

trees containing no volume and value have also been marked with blue Xs and blue slashes.

EXPIRATION DATE: October 31, 2022.

BID AND PAYMENT METHOD: Sealed bids. Lump sum sale (cash). Payment for timber sale purchase shall be payment of 1/2 of timber sale price at signing of timber sale agreement and the second 1/2 prior to start of logging. Landowner reserves the right to reject any and all bids. Regarding signing of the contract, time is of the essence. Landowner anticipates and expects signing of the timber sale agreement within 30 days after bid opening.

INSURANCE: PURCHASER shall save and hold harmless landowner and his representatives from any and all claims and list the Upshur County Commission and Upshur County Youth Camp Board as an additional insured on liability policy. PURCHASER shall also provide the following proof of insurance:  
\$1,000,000 Liability Insurance  
Proof of current Workers Compensation Insurance

PERFORMANCE BOND: 10% of bid value (unknown). Actual bond amount will be rounded up to an even \$1,000 unit. Performance Bond will be payable at time of signing and payment for timber sale contract. Intent of performance bond is to cover logging reclamation costs if needed.

HARVEST TECHNIQUES: Most skid roads and the haul road have been built previously. Portions of a gas well access road and a pipeline access road will need to be used as skid roads. Additional skid roads which need to be built shall be approved by Forester prior to construction. Culverts shall be installed when crossing seeps and springs. At the completion of skidding, all culverts not needed for farm and log haul access road may be removed. PURCHASER shall follow practices as specified in the West Virginia Forest Practices Standards including logger and company licensing and certification.

PROJECTS:

PERMITS: PURCHASER shall obtain a permit for crossing pipeline R/W from Columbia Gas.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS: 1) All trees or portions which fall onto neighboring landowners and the pipeline R/W shall be immediately removed.  
2) Pipeline access and gas well access roads shall be maintained at all times for use by 4-wheeler.

- 3) Crossing of pipeline R/W shall be in accordance with provisions of Columbia Gas permit including matting of crossing from tree line to tree line and no rutting of R/W. All other pipeline crossings shall be matted and covered with a minimum of 1 foot of dirt.
- 4) All easements for access have been obtained.
- 5) All skid roads shall have berms removed and shall be leveled and smoothed after completion of skidding. Skid roads shall also have rolling dips constructed as needed to divert water runoff.
- 6) Landing and skid road(s) within 200' of landing and skid roads for 50' on either side of spring crossings shall be seeded and mulched with hay after completion of all logging activities.
- 7) Any skid roads or portions of skid roads which are at or above 15% grade shall be seeded and fertilized.







# Timber Sale Agreement

This AGREEMENT, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2019 by and between \_\_\_\_\_ Upshur County Commission \_\_\_\_\_ whose address is \_\_\_\_\_ 91 West Main Street, Buckhannon, WV 26201 \_\_\_\_\_ hereinafter referred to as the SELLER, and \_\_\_\_\_ whose address is \_\_\_\_\_ hereinafter referred to as the PURCHASER.

## WITNESSETH:

ARTICLE I. The SELLER hereby agrees to sell and the PURCHASER agrees to purchase, according to conditions and requirements hereinafter mentioned, all live timber MARKED OR DESIGNATED by two blue paint spots at Diameter Breast High and on stump for cutting all merchantable timber located in Banks Magisterial District, Upshur County; and further described as follows: Portion of Map Parcel #5S - 51 located in the northeast corner of Selbyville Youth Camp. The timber sale is also situated east of and on the waters of the Right Fork of Buckhannon River.

ARTICLE II. The PURCHASER further agrees to pay the SELLER the total sum of \_\_\_\_\_ for the 927 designated trees whose volume is estimated to be 176,234 board feet measure, more or less, as determined by the DOYLE tree scale.

ARTICLE III. The PURCHASER further agrees, before cutting any material referred to in this AGREEMENT, to make payment according to the following schedule:

Payment ½ at signing of contract.  
Payment ½ prior to start of logging.

ARTICLE IV. This AGREEMENT cannot be assigned in whole or in part without the consent of the SELLER.

ARTICLE V. All operations on the timber sale area may be suspended by the SELLER, in writing, if conditions and requirements set forth in this AGREEMENT are disregarded. Failure to comply with the said conditions and requirements, if persisted in after receipt of written notification from the SELLER, shall be sufficient cause to terminate this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE VI. The SELLER agrees to the following conditions and requirements:

- A. To guarantee title to the forest products covered by this Agreement. Property lines for this tract were marked or designated by the SELLER or his AGENT. Any dispute concerning boundary line location shall be the responsibility of the SELLER.
- B. To grant freedom of entry and right-of-way to the PURCHASER and his employees on and across the area covered by this AGREEMENT provided such entry and/or right-of-way does not conflict with specific provisions of this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE VII. The PURCHASER further agrees to cut and remove the said timber in strict compliance with the following conditions and requirements:

- A. All timber shall be cut and removed from the premises of the SELLER on or before October 31, 2022 by the PURCHASER.
- B. The PURCHASER further agrees to those practices as specified in The West Virginia Forest Practices Standards and to follow The Best Management Practices under the 208 Program where practicable.
- C. To do all within his and his employees' power, both independently and upon request of the SELLER to prevent and suppress forest fires.
- D. To cut stumps no higher than 12 inches adjacent to the highest ground, except in cases of forked trees and to utilize the tops to the smallest practicable diameter, preferably 10 inches.
- E. Undesignated trees which are cut or damaged through negligence shall be paid for at the rate of triple the stumpage price as appraised by the Forester designated and/or contracted by the Upshur County Commission during the terms of this agreement. Trees which are damaged through accident may be cut at the discretion of the Forester and paid for at the rate of a stumpage price as appraised by Forester. Trees which need to be cut for construction of skid roads shall be approved or designated by the Forester prior to cutting and paid for at the rate of a stumpage price as appraised by Forester. Volumes will be determined by the Forester using DOYLE tree scale and will include flagrant damage to remaining stand from cutting, felling, or skidding.
- F. The PURCHASER shall keep all structures used in connection with this scale, and the grounds in their vicinity, in a sanitary condition. All debris, such as paper, cans, bottles, oil filters, etc., left on the sale area shall be disposed of by the PURCHASER on completion of the operation. Sanitation measures specified in the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 shall be met.
- G. The PURCHASER agrees to the following specifications regarding skid and haul roads and location of landings:
  - 1) Most skid roads have been built previously. Existing roads shall be used wherever practical.
  - 2) Additional skid roads which need to be built must be approved by Forester prior to construction.
  - 3) Pipeline access and gas well access roads shall be maintained at all times for use by a 4-wheeler.
  - 4) Crossing of pipeline R/W shall be in accordance with provisions of Columbia Gas permit including matting of crossing from tree line to tree line and no rutting of R/W. All other pipeline crossings shall be matted and covered with a minimum of 1 foot of dirt. All mats may be removed after completion and acceptance of reclamation beyond the mats.
  - 5) Culverts shall be installed on skid roads when crossing seeps and springs. At the completion of skidding, all culverts installed by Purchaser for logging skid roads may be removed.

- H. Trees or portions of trees that fall onto adjacent landowners' property shall be removed immediately by PURCHASER. All trees which fall into streams, fields, or gas line right-of-ways shall be removed before topping or limbing.
- I. Fences, roads, bridges, and other improvements shall be protected from damage during the logging operation and if damaged shall be repaired to their original condition by the PURCHASER. (1) The PURCHASER agrees to suspend operation of logging equipment on main access roads during periods that would cause excess rutting of road surface.
- J. Young growth and trees left standing shall be protected from unnecessary damage.
- K. The PURCHASER agrees to use the following measures to retard erosion on skid trails and haul roads upon completion of the operation:
  1. All roads used for harvest of this designated timber shall be smoothed and drained by the PURCHASER. All road berms shall be pulled back into the road. Road shoulders shall be out sloped to allow drainage of water off the road surface. Water bars or rolling dips shall be installed where indicated by Forester.
  2. Pipeline access and gas well access roads shall be ditched and have broad based dips installed where indicated by Forester. These roads shall be left in a condition which would be useable by a 4WD truck during dry weather.
  3. If the PURCHASER plans to discontinue active logging in the sale area before the operation is completed, then the PURCHASER shall install water bars on roads and trails where indicated by Forester.
  4. All log landings shall be smoothed and drained and all logging residue shall be removed from landing by PURCHASER.
  5. Log landing and skid road(s) within 200' of landing shall be seeded and mulched. Spring crossings shall be seeded and fertilized for a distance of 50' on either side of spring crossing. Pipeline crossing shall be seeded and mulched for the width of the pipeline R/W. Any skid roads or portion of a skid road with a grade in excess of 15% shall be seeded and fertilized.

The Forester will inspect the area during cutting and upon completion of the operation to insure all measures meet the requirements of this AGREEMENT.

- L. The PURCHASER hereby agrees to protect, indemnify and save harmless SELLER from any and all liability for personal injuries, death and/or property damage suffered or incurred by any person in connection with the PURCHASER'S performance of this contract. PURCHASER shall also provide the following proof of insurance:  
 \$1,000,000 Liability Insurance  
 Proof of current Workers Compensation Insurance  
 PURCHASER shall also list the Upshur County Commission and Upshur County Youth Camp Board as an additional insured on liability policy.

M. The PURCHASER agrees to furnish Upshur County Commission with a performance bond in the amount of 10% of the bid value. Actual bond amount will be rounded up to an even \$1,000 unit. Intent of performance bond is to cover logging reclamation costs if needed. PURCHASER'S performance bond shall be in the form of a surety bond, cashier's or certified check, money order, assignment of surety, or irrevocable letter of credit. Performance bond shall be kept in effect during the term of the agreement. Upshur County Commission shall release PURCHASER'S bond upon acceptance of completed and inspected logging reclamation.

N. In case of dispute over the terms of this AGREEMENT, final decision shall rest with arbitrators, one of whom shall be selected by each party of this contract, and in case the two selected shall disagree, they shall select a third arbitrator, and the decision of the majority shall be final with respect either to acts to be done or compensation to be paid by either party to the other.

# James W. Curry Library/Park Advisory Board Minutes March 27, 2019

The March 27, 2019 meeting of the James W. Curry Library/Park Advisory Board was called to order by President Mike Quinn at 10:00 am.

**Roll Call:** Present – Mike Quinn, Al Lake, Erv Lake, Patricia Tolliver, Carrie Wallace and Tink Simmons

Absent: Lori Ulderich-Harvey

Guests: Nate Kennedy

Staff: Judith Williams, Jonathan Freeman, Darlene Gregory

Minutes: Minutes of the October 24, 2018 Advisory Board Meeting were approved; motion by Al, seconded by Erv; motion passed.

## **Public Comment Period:**

There were no public comments.

## **Staff Report:**

**Park:** Jonathan reported that hunting season was quiet; no complaints were received. He did find three carcasses that were stripped and dumped on the pipeline. A barricade was constructed to keep people off of the logging trails. Signs along the road have all disappeared and will need to be replaced. The Advisory Board questioned the legality of signs in lieu of purple paint. Erv explained the requirements and further confirmed that signs can be used in lieu of paint. The campground activity continues to be slow. He had some primitive campers before Christmas for one night, three campers for the Maple Syrup Festival, three reserved for the Blue Grass Festival and one for the Brooks Hill Fair. The sole pavilion rental since the last meeting was cancelled. The Park and Library sustained some wind damage over the winter months. The restroom in the Park was affected and three old pines had to be removed. Only five remain standing. A piece of fascia was blown off of the Library and there was some damage to the large library sign. Jonathan stayed busy with maintenance over the winter and also installed a TV in the Library and repaired the flood damage to the library restrooms. Currently he is repairing the story walk and preparing to begin construction on the space capsule for Summer Reading.

Jonathan discussed the library's lack of lighting with the Advisory Board. Many of the lights are currently out and Jonathan needs to either replace the bulbs or move forward with another type of LED light. Kevin Nicholson and State Electric prepared two proposals for consideration. The first is \$6.45 per tube for 234 tubes (in lots of 6) with a total price of \$1509. The second is \$6.45 per tube for 180 tubes (in lots of 6, for stacks only, with a total price of \$1,161. All agreed that we need to move forward with the purchase either in this FY or FY 20. A recommendation will be made to the County Commission wants the Advisory Board sets the budget for FY 20.

**Library:** Judith reviewed the staff report included in the agenda packet. She explained that numbers are down overall due to many regular users relocating out of the area for work or facing transportation issues. Adult Yoga is growing with a new neighbor expressing interest in participating. Seven adults participated in the quilting project over the winter months with ten kids on-site during the program.

Judith explained how these numbers further support the need for a child safe space. The quilt is near completion; Opal will be taking it home to finish the backing and binding. The Fundraising Committee will soon be selling 6 tickets for \$5 or \$1 each. Cataloging continues to be a priority with over 7000 (7776) items successfully cataloged. Judith is awaiting responses on two grants that were submitted over the winter. One is for the remaining funds needed to bring the coding club to reality and the other is for a pumpkin patch for education and fundraising.

Judith has attended four different trainings since our last meeting. One provided materials for great outreach opportunities into the school system, two were NASA trainings in preparation for Summer Reading and the other was a Service Center day at the Upshur County Public Library. All were beneficial sources of training and networking. Judith learned and reported that grant reviews are changing to be story – project outcome based which is expected to benefit small libraries like ours with much lower circulation than large competitors.

Judith is currently searching for a new (free) website host as Google is no longer hosting websites effective April 2<sup>nd</sup> and is busy planning for Summer Reading scheduled for June 4-16<sup>th</sup>. Rock Cave Elementary has responded to Judith's inquiries and they do want to coordinate with Summer Reading which is great news.

There has been tons of activity on the Library Facebook Page regarding the Curry Scholarship. Two individuals have picked up applications in the Library. Commissioner Cutright reviewed the scholarship award process with the Advisory Board.

**Timber:** The timber sale is complete, including reclamation. Northwest Hardwoods finished logging in early September. There was an issue with reclamation at the landing. In order to resolve the issue, Northwest buried the debris to prevent it from being an eyesore. Nate also discovered a soft spot from an old coal seam. The adjoining wanted to install a fence to block the timber road access; however, Nate requested that they leave it open for bicycle traffic. Hemlock trees were never dropped over the skid road. The skid road is so deeply rutted that he doesn't believe 4-wheelers would have access anyway. Nate's letter requesting release of the bid bond will be sent to the Commission to Carrie's attention.

## **Old Business:**

**Consideration of Bike Trails on Curry Property** – Nate still needs to speak with Nathan Fetty. He will reach out now that we are into better weather. Judith will be contacting Laura Meadows, Upshur County CVB Executive Director, regarding advertising materials once she knows if the bike trails are going to come to fruition. The Advisory Board discussed emergency response to individuals who are injured and the need for signs noting liability.

**DVD security** – Judith resolved the issue well under budget with the purchase of two sets of drawers and sleeves for \$269.58. They seem to be working out well, but are more time consuming. She will need to purchase one more set of drawers for \$110.00.

**New Business:**


