After reviewing conditions on the ground, final reclamation of the Curry Park Timber Sale, also known as Millsite Run South '16 TS, has been accepted. During the course of logging there were a total of 10 trees which had to be cut for road and landing construction or were knocked over and taken out. These trees are being added into the timber sale as additional timber to be cut and paid for. These 10 trees had a total volume of 1,679 board feet Doyle Scale and a value of \$348.10. There was a Performance bond of \$8,000 for the timber sale. The value of the trees will be subtracted from the value of the Performance Bond and the Performance Bond released in the amount of \$7,651.90.

The road right-of-way consists of ~ 1500 ' existing skid road. The right-of-way width shall be sufficient to allow for use and maintenance of an existing <u>logging skid road</u>.

The successful bidder (Purchaser) of the timber sale shall be required to keep and maintain liability insurance naming the Upshur County Commission and Upshur County Youth Camp as additional insured in an amount not less than \$1 million and Workers Compensation for the duration of the timber sale contract. Contractors and subcontractors of the Purchaser are also included in the requirements of this provision.

The Purchaser (and their contractors) of the timber sale shall not obstruct or interfere with vehicle traffic on any of the roadways covered by this agreement.

The Purchaser (and their contractors) of the timber sale shall cease log haul during periods of weather which would cause rutting of the road or transport of mud from logging and/or hauling operations to be deposited on roads and lands of the grantor.

The Purchaser (and their contractors) of the timber sale shall reclaim the skid road to its original condition.

AUDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICTS

Pursuant to West Virginia State Code §6-9-7, the Chief Inspector Division of the West Virginia State Auditor's Office (CID) has the power and authority to perform a financial examination (including annual audits) of each local government office or **political subdivision** and all boards, commissions, authorities, agencies or other offices created under the authority thereof. West Virginia Code §16-13A-3 describes the legal identity of Public Service Districts as a "public corporation and **political subdivision** of the state". Based on the foregoing and effective for fiscal years beginning in 2019, the CID will be overseeing the audit process of all Public Service Districts (PSDs) in the State of West Virginia in accordance with statutory requirements and established procedures.

The Chief Inspector may appoint a designee to perform the annual audit function of this financial oversight responsibility. The execution of audit designation is accomplished through a bidding process between entities and CPA firms meeting the criteria for and included on the List of CPA Firms Appointed to Conduct Audits and Reviews of Local Government Entities (CPA List), as provided for by the Procedures Manual for Procuring and Conducting Audits and Reviews of Local Governments (manual).



The *manual* can be viewed on the CID's website at: https://www.wvsao.gov/ChiefInspector/Default.

Early in the calendar year 2020, the PSDs will be notified by the CID whether they will need to procure an audit with a CPA firm on the *CPA List* or whether the engagement will be assigned to CID audit staff. All necessary procurement forms will be provided to the PSD, for CPA procurement from the approved *CPA List*. In most cases, CID will honor an entity's request to be issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to procure audit services in accordance with the *manual* procedures.

In order to facilitate the implementation process of audit oversight, the CID is requesting each PSD to complete and submit the enclosed questionnaire along with a copy of the most recently issued audit report. This information may be submitted via email at <u>cpaaudits@wvsao.gov</u>. Alternatively, you may mail it to the following address:

Your cooperation is appreciated, and we believe that this process will enhance the timeliness of audits as well as foster a competitive bidding environment for CPA firms. It will also ensure that instances of potential fraud associated with local PSD's are properly investigated. New Financial Examination Requirements RE:

This is to notify you that House Bill 2958, which was passed on March 6, 2019, added a new section to West Virginia Code designated as West Virginia Code §8-15-7a. House Bill 2958 becomes effective 90 days from its passage.

West Virginia Code §8-15-7a grants the West Virginia State Auditor's Office authority to conduct a financial examination or audit of a Volunteer Fire Department (hereinafter referred to as VFD) at least once every five years. The Auditor's examination or audit shall include all income of the VFD, regardless of the sources of funds, the assets, liabilities, and all expenditures of the entity.

Therefore, we are requiring all VFDs to complete and submit the attached form no later than Friday, April 26, 2019, to assist our office in administering these required examinations. We are also requesting a copy of the VFDs latest audit report (if applicable). Please remit the completed form and audit (if applicable) via e-mail at cpaaudits@wvsao.gov or fax to (304)-558-6414. OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS FROM THE DISTRICT PERSPECTIVE



In October each year, the District Design Department receives a memorandum from the State Highway Engineer's Office describing the Scope of Work, Funding Levels for A10 (Federal Aid Other Paving) and A13 (State and Local Service Paving) Programs, along with bid timelines, requirements for programming projects, etc. A20 (Tar and Chip), B20 (State Force Skip Paving), B30 (District Forces Slide Repair), and B31 (Contract Slide Repair) program funds are confirmed with the District by the Regional Programming Coordinator prior to the District sending any programming information through for projects.

Any additional funding for Interstate/APD projects also comes out as memorandums from the State Highway Engineer's Office, as well as any funding for special projects that may not be covered under a specific program.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS:

- A10 Fed Aid Other (80/20) 80% Federal Participating Funding for paving used for Federal Aid eligible routes other than Interstates, APD's and Expressways. These projects require full PS&E (Plans, Standards, & Estimates) submittals for contractor bidding.
- **A13 State Local Service Paving Paving either via Contract Bidding or Purchase Order Contract. Generally used only on State Local Service Routes, but may be used for Fed Aid eligible routes with full PS&E submittal to contract.**
- A20 Tar and Chip (Surface Treatment) District wide Tar and Chip Program by District/County Forces.
- **B20** State Skip Paving District wide skip paving, either via Purchase Order Contract or by District Forces.
- B30 District Forces Slide Repair Programmed for slide repairs via Purchase Order Contract repair or by District Forces.
- **B31 Contract Slide Repair** Programmed for slide repairs via Contract PS&E, but may also be used for Purchase Order Contract repairs.
- C23 Bridge Renovations varies yearly; District-wide bridge renovation program.
- C26 Small Bridge Replacement funding to replace bridges between 20' and 200' long.
- C28 Spot Painting of Bridges funding for spot painting bridge substructures.


