

UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSION
EMERGENCY MEETING
July 26, 2018

The County Commission of Upshur County, West Virginia, held an emergency meeting at the Upshur County Administrative Annex on Thursday, July 26, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. Samuel Nolte called the meeting to order. There were present Samuel R. Nolte, Commissioner; Terry Cutright, Commissioner; Troy A. Brady, Commissioner; Carol J. Smith, County Clerk; Carrie L. Wallace, County Administrator; and Tabatha R. Perry, Assistant County Administrator. The meeting began with a moment of silent meditation and prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All motions passed unanimously, unless otherwise stated.

Jodie Akers, Director of Student Services for Upshur County Board of Education and Jeff Harvey, owner and operator of JH Consulting provided an overview of the 2018 COPS Office Stop School Violence: School Violence Prevention Program (SVPP) application. Mr. Harvey explained that the Upshur County and Lewis County Boards of Education have partnered in an effort to submit a more enticing grant application and, if successful, will equip both school systems with roughly \$400,000.00 in modernized security equipment. Carrie Wallace discussed grant administration and financial requirements of the Commission and BOE's. Upshur County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Sarah Stankus, expressed thanks to the Commission for their willingness to hold an Emergency Meeting to consider the grant submission on behalf of the BOE's. On motion by Troy A. Brady seconded by Terry B. Cutright, the Commission approved the signature of application for Federal Assistance SF-424 for the 2018 COPS Office STOP SVPP (due July 26, 2018) and the second phase application through the COPS Office Online Application System (due July 30, 2018).

With no further business, on motion by Troy A. Brady, seconded by Terry Cutright, the Commission adjourned at 4:38 p.m.
