The American Cancer Society sponsors the Great American Smokeout on the third Thursday of November (November 18, 2021) each year, challenging smokers to give up cigarettes for 24 hours. If you or a loved one smokes cigarettes, consider joining the movement, and take the first step toward quitting cigarettes forever!


In our state, a pack of cigarettes costs approximately \$6.62 plus tax, so if you multiply that one pack a day, the monthly cost is over \$200. To take that to a yearly cost, it is roughly \$2,400. If you quit, you could take your family on a week-long vacation, afford a monthly utility payment. Even if you only quit for four months, you could purchase a laptop/tablet and internet service.

E-cigarette use, or vaping, among adults and youth is an **epidemic** in West Virginia. Vaping use rates are rising faster in West Virginia than rates across the nation. More than 1 in 3 (35.7%) West Virginia high school students report current use of e-cigarettes. This is a 150% increase from 2017 to 2019 alone. The high school tobacco use rate is 40.6%.

Studies show that second and thirdhand smoke also poses health risks. Secondhand smoke can increase lung cancer by 20-30%. Smoke from the end of a cigarette has a higher concentration of the cancer-causing chemicals than the smoke exhaled by a smoker. The US EPA says secondhand smoke is among the most dangerous substances known to cause cancer. Thirdhand smoke refers to the toxins from cigarette smoke that stick to soft surfaces. Thirdhand smoke not only affects adults but also babies, children, and even pets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Upshur County Commission hereby recognizes and supports the American Cancer Society's GREAT AMERICAN SMOKEOUT on November 18, 2021, in Upshur County and encourages all citizens who smoke, use chew or dip tobacco, vape, or any other devices to ingest nicotine to demonstrate to themselves and to their children that they can quit by joining the American Cancer Society's Great American Smokeout.

A proclamation of Upshur County Commission recognizing November 2021 as National Adoption Month:

National Adoption Month is an initiative of the Children's Bureau with a goal to increase national awareness and bring attention to the need for permanent families for children and youth in the U.S. foster care system.

For over two decades, National Adoption Month has been promoted and celebrated every November in communities across the country. Many national, state, and local agencies as well as foster, kinship care, and adoptive family groups will help spread the word through programs, events, and activities that help raise awareness for thousands of children and youth in foster care who are waiting for permanent, loving families. This year National Adoption Day is Saturday, November 20th.

As of May 2020, there are approximately 7,200 children in foster care with just over 3,000 foster families registered (not including kinship homes). As of November 2021 there are no current numbers, but, the estimation is now close to or over 8,000. The numbers continue to climb at an alarming rate. There are also a great deal of children living with family members who do not seek services in fear that the children will be removed from their care, so that only increases the number of foster children in our state.

Upshur County FRN continues to raise awareness of foster care and adoption in the hopes that these children can be placed in forever homes. We work to present the

facts and dispel the myths to the journey to foster and/or adopt by holding foster care open houses and is currently starting a foster care and adoption peer group in Upshur County. Currently the UCFRN is working with the senior center in bringing the West Virginia State University program Healthy Grandfamilies to Upshur County this past summer and the current fall session.

Many children awaiting adoptive families were removed from their biological families due to abuse, neglect or abandonment. These children have endured hardships, sadness, loss of relationships, and abuse. All of these children deserve a permanent home. Without a permanent, loving adoptive home, these children face the likelihood of entering adulthood with no parental guidance or support. We believe that all children deserve a loving, safe home.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSION, that they hereby proclaim November 2021 as National Adoption Month and November 20, 2021 as National Adoption Day in Upshur County and encourage the residents of Upshur County to consider fostering or adopting a child or donating time, resources, or educating and advocating for our kids. We also celebrate all of the adoptions that have taken place in Upshur County.

Staff Reports

Park: Not much to report. Slowest year Jonathan has seen since her has been here. Upcoming Crookedfest, and Labor Day weekend have only one reservation each so far. Pavilions are getting frequent weekend use. A limb fell through the roof of the outhouse in the campground. There are enough materials onsite to make the necessary repairs. Jonathan thanked the Community Building for help with weed eating in preparation for the fair.

Library: Statistical reports can be reviewed at leisure. We had a successful Summer Reading program serving 224 children and 140 adults. Tuesday evening Family Storytime has resumed and we had 5 "new" children. The Glow Stick Party went well raising \$338.13 for children's programming. The Brooks Hill Fair went smoothly raising \$392.80 for children's programming after expenses. 11,896 items in the collection have now been cataloged. Region VII said they could not include the server replacement in their grant, but have put 2 public access computers with monitors in: we are awaiting word as to if and/or when that may materialize. The quilt raised \$569.00 this year. The Callanetics classes taught by Beverly Fantasia are slated to resume in September. We are waiting to hear if the SVFD will be doing its Fall/Halloween Hayride or not; outcome of their meeting will determine what we will do at the library in conjunction with them. Other upcoming events are the community Trick or Treat, Santa's Workshop children's program and the Christmas @ Curry Festival of Lights. Lori Ulderich Harvey said FRN would include a \$100.00 allocation towards the Glow Stick Party in 2022 in their PIP Grant application.

Timber: Quote from the log buyer \$1.50 board foot for standing tree. Interest disappeared in response to discussion about limb clean up. Standing dead tree – an interesting question, value would drop, even though walnut holds up well. Second tree has problems; 1/3 limbs dead. Instead of selling both have Jonathan take out the one with dead spots, cut to log length, find a safe place to store. Question was raised, could Jonathan clean up the limbs. How many board feet are in each tree – 1042 board feet (tree with dead limbs) and the other 720 board feet (1762 @ 1.50/bf or \$2643 less clean up or \$1700-1800 realized) Healthy tree can probably wait 10-12 years until the adjacent property is harvested. Buyer to pay the hauling cost. Motion was made by Shanna to table further discussion until we see if money from Fulton comes through. Motion seconded by Sara, motion carried.

Review/Report

Old Business:

FY22 Budget: Carrie reviewed the budget as submitted by Judith and Jonathan, the tracking documentation for the Trust, and the letter to the County Commission requesting additional funds. Discussion with Fulton Financial indicated that in the interest of keeping the most money available for growth a letter detailing the shortfall will be required this year and every year moving forward unless we have a timber sale. In preparing the budget revenue the anticipated Trust disbursements were tightened due to market volatility with a view to erring on the side of caution. The General County fund pays employees, and then is reimbursed quarterly. Debra Hull has been splitting expenses between park and library, but needs to move back to whichever account has the higher balance as has been the practice in the past since costs frequently overlap. There was discussion as to the immediacy of the need for gravel in the campground and it was generally agreed that this was a project that could be postponed given the current financial environment. Sara moved to remove gravel from this year's budget. Motion was seconded by Shanna; motion passed. Tink moved to accept the budget and execute the letter to the Commission requesting that they initiate the additional allocation from the Trust by letter to Fulton. Lori seconded the motion; motion passed.

New Business:

Correspondence to County Commission regarding additional appropriation from the Trust (included in old business discussion of budget). Action noted above.

JoAnn Ritter contacted Terry in regard to service on the Murphy Station Rd. The line ends at Stanford Zirkles with a blow off valve. Terry feels it is too far and explained to Ms. Ritter the long service line agreement. She was to get back in touch if interested.

Terry filed the necessary paperwork for the main line extension request for Katherine Tiziani located near the Barbour Co line on the Teter Rd.

The Board reviewed the Preliminary Annual Report for year ending 6/30/21. Terry will be finalizing the report and filing with the PSC with the next few weeks.

On the rate increase Terry signed a notarized letter indicating that the CWCR Account had been opened at First Community Bank. This document was then forwarded to the PSC.
