

UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSION  
EMERGENCY MEETING  
October 7, 2020

The County Commission of Upshur County, West Virginia, held an emergency meeting via teleconference on Wednesday, October 7, 2020 at 3:30 p.m. Terry B. Cutright, President, called the meeting to order. Participating were Samuel R. Nolte, Commissioner; Terry B. Cutright, Commissioner; Kristie G. Tenney, Commissioner; and Carrie L. Wallace, County Administrator. Others attending via teleconference included Elected Officials, Judicial Staff and the public. All motions passed unanimously, unless otherwise stated.

After discussion, on motion by Sam Nolte, seconded by Kristie Tenney, the Commission approved to close the Courthouse, Annex and other County owned and operated facilities to the public, with the exemption of the James W. Curry Library's Virtual School Program until October 21, 2020, at which time the Courthouse will reopen at a minimum for residents to participate in early voting. Appointments with the public for time sensitive matters may be scheduled at each Elected Officials' discretion. Elected Officials may continue working limited staff in each office while other employees telework at their discretion. In addition, the Lewis-Upshur Animal Control Facility will be open to the public by appointment only. The Commission will reassess the number of active cases when determining if the other facilities will fully reopen on October 21, 2020. The Commission will reassess the operations of the Courthouse and County owned and operated facilities within the next two weeks. The Commission Meeting scheduled for October 7, 2020, will be in person; however, the public and members of the press will only be permitted to participate via teleconference.

With no further business, on motion by Kristie Tenney, seconded by Sam Nolte, the Commission adjourned at 3:43 p.m.
