### Wakulla Gardens Sewer Expansion Phase 4

Wakulla County is pleased to inform you that sewer service is coming to your neighborhood! This sewer expansion project is part of a comprehensive program to remove all wastewater discharges within the Wakulla Springs Basin. We anticipate construction to begin the summer of 2023.

The County is making a one-time offer to each impacted homeowner that is currently on a septic tank, to connect to sewer at no cost to the homeowner. Funding for the Sewer Collection system project is being provided by The Florida Department of Environmental Protection through Northwest Florida Water Management District. This offer includes having your septic tank abandoned and running sewer lines from your home to the sewer tap.

After you are connected to the County's sewer system, you will be required to set up a sewer account with Wakulla County Revenue Collections and make a sewer deposit of \$110. Also, you will be billed for sewer monthly. Your sewer bill will be based on your water usage. The current sewer rate is \$39.04 for the first 2,000 gallons of water used plus \$5.86 for each additional 1,000 gallons.

Please indicate your acceptance by completing and returning the attached "Access Agreement" giving permission for contractors to access your property to abandon your septic tank and run sewer lines to a tap. (You will be notified before work will begin on your property).

In addition, as part of the Sewer Expansion project, Wakulla County will be paving the roads after the sewer construction is completed. The paving project will be paid for out of your local One Cent Sales Tax Road Paving Fund.

Please note that this is a one-time offer and must be accepted before construction begins (anticipated in 2023). **Florida Statutes section 381.00655 (1)(a) requires that homes be connected to county sewer within one year from the date sewer is available to connect. Note that all associated costs at that time would be the homeowner's responsibility.**
