
A RICH HERITAGE

LOCATION AND LOGISTICS

Strategically located between the state's two largest cities - Madison and Milwaukee - Watertown's location is hard to beat. Minutes from Interstate 94, which quickly connects to Madison (45 miles west) and Milwaukee (45 miles east), businesses are able to draw from large city amenities while enjoying lower operational costs.

Your business' suppliers and customers are in reach. Watertown's logistics connect businesses to a population of 74,880,128 within 500 miles or one-day's travel. This includes major markets such as Milwaukee, Chicago, St. Paul/Minneapolis, Dubuque, Quad Cities, Indianapolis, St. Louis and Cincinnati.
